

ANNUAL ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT OF ECONOMIC AND STATISTICAL ORGANISATION, PUNJAB 2006-2007

Economic and Statistical Organisation acts as the data bank and caters to the statistical needs of the State as well as Central Government, policy makers and research institutions and individual researchers. The Organisation collects primary as well as secondary data at the state, district, block and village level. The data thus collected is compiled, analysed, interpreted and disseminated through various departmental publications. This Organisation also coordinates statistical activities within the State and keeps proper liaison with Central Statistical Organisation, Government of India.

Economic & Statistical Organisation also undertakes evaluation studies concerning plan programmes /schemes at the instance of State Govt. These reports not only help in formulation of development programmes, but also identify the bottlenecks for taking corrective measures in their implementation.

“Statistical Abstract of Punjab” and “Economic Survey of Punjab” are two widely known annual publications of this Organisation which contain comprehensive data-based information on various socio-economic aspects in the State. Both of these publications are Budget Documents .

Economic & Statistical Organisation is headed by Economic Adviser who is assisted by Directors, Joint Directors, Deputy Economic and Statistical Advisers, Research Officers and Assistant Research Officers.

Economic & Statistical Organisation has 17 regular sections. Besides 3 more sections i.e. MPLAD, HDR&CU & Economic Census are working at the State Head Quarter. One section works for the establishment and the remaining sections are engaged in data -based & research oriented technical work. The establishment section manages the human resource administration and is manned by superintendents, senior assistants, clerks and typists. The Directors, Joint Directors and Deputy Economic and Statistical Advisers provide tips of desired guidance in day to day research work on matters relating to Economics and Statistics. The Research Officers and Assistant Research Officers are mainly responsible for analysis and interpretation of data whereas collection and compilation work is done by Statistical Assistants and Investigators .

There is a District Statistical Office in each district of the State headed by Deputy Economic & Statistical Adviser. With the introduction of decentralised planning, Deputy Economic and Statistical Adviser also acts as Additional Secretary of the District Planning and Development Board and is fully involved in the formulation and monitoring of the plan schemes. (A chart showing the administrative set up and distribution of the work of various sections of Organisation is enclosed at the end of the report.)

The activities and the assignments completed by each section/unit during 2006-2007 are given below:-

I. STATE INCOME

This Section prepares estimates of State Domestic Product (SDP) both at current and at constant (1999-2000) prices for all the fifteen sectors of the economy along with

per capita income regularly with a time lag of two years. District-wise sectoral estimates of SDP both at current and constant prices for each year are also prepared. Quick estimates of SDP based on production targets of Agriculture, Livestock, Forestry and Fishing sectors are prepared annually with a time lag of one year. Sector wise growth rates of SDP for different periods are prepared to study the trend of State's Economy. In addition to it, notes on economic situation in the state and comparative position of the states' vis-à-vis other states with respect to State Domestic Product are prepared for the use of State Government.

During the year 2006-2007 following work was done:-

1. The following estimates of SDP at current and constant (1999-2000) prices were prepared for all the fifteen sectors of the economy.
 - a) Provisional Estimates of Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) and Net State Domestic Product (NSDP) with new base from 1999-2000 to 2004-05.
 - b) Quick estimates of GSDP and NSDP for the year 2005-2006.
 - c) District-wise estimates have been prepared for the year 2003-04 at current and constant (1993-94) prices.
2. Information regarding economic situation and growth rates were prepared for inclusion in budget speech of Finance Minister, Punjab and for Governor's address in Budget Session of Punjab.
3. Following data was sent to Central Statistical Organisation, Govt. of India, New Delhi.
 - a) Comparable sectorwise data on State Domestic Product for the year 1999-2000 to 2004-05 at current & constant prices.
 - b) Data relating to employment and compensation of employees of Municipal Committees/Corporations under Water Supply sector.
 - c) Information regarding slaughtered animals of Livestock sector for the year 2004-05.
 - d) Production and price for Fishery and Forestry sector for the year 2004-05.
 - e) Information regarding production, prices and area under agriculture and horticulture crops for agriculture sector no of tractors and No. of diesel engines in Punjab for the year 2004-05.
4. Gross State Domestic Product on current and constant prices was sent to A.G. Punjab.
5. Two workshops (7.8.2006 to 11.8.2006 and 17.10.2006 to 18.10.2006) were held at Delhi regarding comparison of State Income estimates prepared by State with Central Statistics Organisation and one workshop was conducted by C.S.O. Govt. of India from 27.11.06 to 1.12.2006 at Jodhpur as training for preparation of district level estimates.
6. Economic Survey of Punjab for the year 2005-06, State Income estimates for the year 1999-2007 and growth rates of 11th plan were given on the website www.pbplanning.gov.in.

II. PUBLIC FINANCE

This section undertakes economic analysis of State Govt. budget and budgets of Municipal Councils/Corporations Nagar Panchayats Macro economic data regarding Public Finance is maintained and supplied for various uses.

During the year 2006-2007 following work was done:-

1. Economic & Functional Classification of Municipal Budget for studying the impact of the budgetary transactions of all the Municipal Corporations in the State for the year 2003-04 and 2004-05 was prepared and got approved from the competent authority. The publication for the year 2005-06 is under preparation.
2. Publication, Statistics of "Public Finance Punjab" relates to comparative study of revenue receipts and revenue expenditure of all the state in India. The publication for the year 2004-05 was prepared and approved by the competent authority and placed on website www.pbplanning.gov.in. The publication for the year 2005-06 is under preparation.

III. CAPITAL FORMATION

This section prepares estimates of Gross State Domestic Capital Formation for all the 13 sectors of the economy at current as well as at constant (1999-2000) prices both for public and private sectors. These estimates were compiled asset wise, institution wise and industry wise for the state as a whole. Besides, this section is also making attempts to prepare the estimates of consumption of fixed capital (CFC) for nine sectors of the economy with the help of Central Statistical Organisation, Govt. of India.

During the year 2006-2007 following work was done:-

1. Due to change of base year 1999-2000 New series the Estimates of Gross State Domestic Capital Formation for all the the thirteen sectors of the Punjab Economy at current as well as at constant prices for the year 1999-2000 to 2004-05 were under preparation. This work of Capital Formation Section is being done by the staff of State Income Section alongwith the work of State Income Section.

IV. EMPLOYMENT

The Advisory Committee of Economists set up by the Planning Commission to examine the recommendations of Dantawala Committee of experts recommended that suitable surveys and studies be undertaken in the field of employment and man power. Keeping in view the above, the Punjab Govt. established an employment cell in Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab for conducting the studies under the schemes "Impact on Employment in Command Areas of Industrial and Power Projects and spread its effect on the Employment in the adjoining areas." The Employment section has conducted twelve studies so far.

During the year 2006-2007 following work was done:-

On the basis of information received from Department of Food , Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs Punjab and Director, Employment, Punjab; two tables each regarding retail rates charged by the fair price shops, distribution of essential commodities and employment in the organized sector, number of job seekers on the live register of employment exchanges were prepared and sent to concerned section for its inclusion in Economic Survey 2006-07. Besides this, the chapters 'Employment' and 'Public distribution system' were also prepared for their inclusion in Economic Survey 2006-07.

V. INDUSTRIAL STATISTICS

This section was set up in 1967-68 in E.S.O. with the objective of collection and compilation of industrial statistics in the State. Industry plays an important role in the development of Economy of the country/state. The level of development in the country /State is mainly determined by the contribution of its industrial sector in the Gross State Domestic Product.

On the recommendations of CSO (Govt. of India) this section has been compiling State Level Index of Industrial Production (IIP) annually as well as quarterly with base year 1993-94=100. For this purpose a number of 904 Industrial Units/factories were selected for 111 items including Electricity and Sulphur.

During the year 2006-2007 following work was done:-

1. Industry code-wise and Districtwise summary results for the year 2004-05 were prepared for State Statistical Abstract 2006 for some key parameters on the basis of ASI results received from Central Statistical Organisation, (Govt. of India.)
2. State quarterwise and Annual Index of Industrial Production (IIP) was prepared for the year 2004-05 (P) with base year 1993-94=100 for the selected 111 items two digit level of NIC-1987 on the basis of 607 responding units were prepared and sent to the CSO (G.O.I) for approval. These comparative indices were released for the State Statistical Abstract-2006 and Economic Survey 2006-2007.

VI. PLAN EVALUATION

This section was set up in the Economic and Statistical Organisation, Punjab in 1964. The evaluation section is engaged in evaluating various programmes/ schemes being implemented by various departments. These reports are helpful to the planners and administrators in formulating the schemes/programmes which help in taking the corrective measures for removing the bottlenecks. Besides this section undertakes con-current quick evaluation of different development schemes. Since its inception this section has conducted 173 evaluation studies.

During the year 2006-2007 following evaluation studies were conducted:-

1. Work of field survey in 8 Apprenticeship Circles regarding Evaluation Study of Apprenticeship Training Scheme has been completed.
2. Evaluation Study of Apprenticeship Training Scheme is under preparation.
3. Counter comments on comments received from concerned department regarding report on Sports Scholarship Scheme were prepared and got approved from E.A.
4. Report on Nation Project on Rinderpest Eradication Programme in Punjab got computerized.
5. The agenda for convening the meeting of State Evaluation Committee was prepared and sent to Secretary Planning.
6. The list of Evaluation Study conducted by Evaluation Section and the reports regarding Member of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme, Share Capital Contribution/ Margin Money to Backfinco (SC 5.1) and Nation Project on Rinderpest Eradication Programme in Punjab were put on website of Planning Department Punjab.

VII. COMPILATION

Compilation section acts as data bank in the department. Wide range of data is made available comprehensively to the State Administrators, Planners and Researchers so as to take important decisions in formulating and implementing the departmental schemes and for undertaking research work in the State. This section also coordinates statistical activities between Govt. of India and various states.

During the year 2006-2007 following work was done:-

1. Twenty Six chapters of Statistical Abstract of Punjab 2006 were prepared and sent to U.T Govt. Printing Press for printing.
2. Material for the Governor's and Finance's Minister's address for the budget session 2007 was prepared and supplied.
3. (i) Annual Administrative Reports for the year 2005-2006 was prepared in English and Punjabi and got computerized. After its approval from EA, it has been sent for approval of CMM.
(ii) Annual Administration Report of Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab consisting of work and activities of the all the sections for the year 2004-05 was prepared in English and Punjabi and got approved.
(iii) Annual Administrative Reports of Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab consisting of work and activities of the all the sections for the year 2003-2004 got approved.
4. Information for the quarterly Statistical Newsletter for the quarters ending 3/2006, 6/2006, 9/2006 and 12/2006 and half yearly report for the half year ending 6/2006 and 12/2006 with regard to National Advisory Board on Statistics was sent to C.S.O. Govt. of India, New Delhi
5. Punjab at a Glance district-wise for the year 2005 was computerized and finalized and got approved. Punjab at a Glance district-wise for the year 2004 was got approved.

Miscellaneous:

6. Meetings

To review the work of E.S.O. Deputy Economic & Statistical Advisers meetings on 23.6.06, 8.8.06, 21.9.06 & 16.1.07 were held. In this regard, agenda notes were prepared and minutes of the meeting were also prepared.

7. Field study for identifying the specific requirements under strengthening of State Statistical System in India, Tier-1 by JPS Associates (P) Ltd. was helped/co-ordinated. In this regard, draft reports of Punjab prepared by them was checked.
8. State Statistical Abstract 2005 and Annual Administrative Report of Economic & Statistical Organisation for the year 2004-05 and 2005-06 were given on the Punjab State Planning Board Website [www.pbplanning .gov.in](http://www.pbplanning.gov.in).

VIII. PRICES

For studying the behavior of prices especially under inflationary pressures, wholesale and retail prices are collected every week. From these prices, monthly price bulletins are prepared. Consumer Price Index Numbers for the working class in Punjab are prepared every month for six centers viz. Abohar, Bathinda, Dhariwal, Nangal, Patiala & Phagwara and supplied to State Government departments and the concerned Industrial units for providing relief to factory workers due to increase in

prices. Data regarding rural retail prices and Agriculture Labour wages are collected and circulated for the information of Central and State Government departments every month. The monthly report of monitoring of retail & wholesale prices of selected essential commodities is prepared.

During the year 2006-2007 the following assignments were completed.

1. Consumer Price Indices (Base 1987=100) for the working class for six selected centres were prepared and issued from 3/06 to 2/2007 and placed on website [www.pbplanning .gov.in](http://www.pbplanning.gov.in)
2. Wholesale Price Bulletin from 3/06 to 2/2007 were prepared and placed on website www.pbplanning .gov.in
3. Statements of Agricultural Labour Wages and Rural Retail Prices from 2/06 to 1/2007 were prepared and sent to Agriculture department Punjab.
4. The monthly report of monitoring of retail & wholesale prices of selected essential commodities were prepared from 4/06 to 3/07.
5. A chapter relating to prices was prepared for Economic Survey 2006-2007.
6. A chapter of prices (containing 14 tables) was prepared for state Statistical Abstract 2006.

IX. FIELD OPERATION

The Field Operation Section of Economic & Statistical Organisation Punjab was set up with the primary objective of improving the quality of statistics at Block and Village level and also to collect additional primary data on various other important socio- economic aspects at village and block level which rarely collected by any other agency. In the present scenario as the concept of Block/Micro level planning is gaining popularity, block level statistics have become more important. Detailed village-wise information is collected and compiled by Investigators posted at the block level then checked by Statistical Assistants/Assistant Research Officers posted at district level under the supervision of District Statistical Officers at district level is supplied to State Head Quarter where the analysis is done. On the basis of the information collected, Village Directories & Block-at-a- glance are prepared by each district of the State.

As directed by Planning Commission, Govt. of India, Village Directory of each district of the State have been placed on website since 1998-99. Block-wise indicators of Socio-Economic Development (Rural) are also prepared yearly. Critical Indicators of Punjab and All India are also being prepared & placed on website. Besides these, various adhoc surveys as recommended by the State Government from time to time are conducted by this unit.

During the year 2006-2007 following work was done:-

1. Village Directory:
 - a) Village Directories for the year 2004-05 of all the districts were computerized and placed on the website of Punjab Government.
 - b) Village Directories for the year 2005-06 of all the districts were received, scrutinized and discrepancies were sent to concerned district for reconciliation.
2. Block –at-a- Glance

- a) Block at a Glance for the year 2004-05 were prepared and scrutinized.
 - b) Block at a Glance for the year 2005-06 of all the districts were computerized.
3. Block Development Indicators
- Blockwise indicators of development for the year 2005-06 of all the districts were received and scrutinized. After removing discrepancies data was finalised.
4. Critical Economic Indicators Punjab Vs India.
- a) Critical Economic Indicators of Punjab Vs India for the year 2003-04 were prepared and got computerized and placed on website www.pbplanning.gov.in.
 - b) Critical Economic Indicators of Punjab Vs India for the year 2004-05 are being prepared.
5. Chapter 'Social Services 'Problems and Prospects and Poverty Alleviation were prepared for inclusion in Economic Survey of Punjab 2006-07.
6. Table no. 13.3 & 13.4. of Chapter 13 were prepared for inclusion in State Statistical Abstract-2006.
7. Under computerization of Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab, financial sanction was released for computers and its peripherals at District level. Proposal for second phase of computerization was sent to Department of Information and Technology for approval.
8. Required information under Right to Information Act, 2005 was prepared and supplied to informants.

X. DEMOGRAPHY & HOUSING

Main function of Demography Section is to prepare below given reports.

1. Census of Punjab Govt. Employees & Semi- Govt. Employees.

The information regarding census of Punjab Govt. and Semi-Govt. employees as on 31st March is collected every year. Data is compiled according to pay ranges, district-wise, department –wise, sex-wise and is published in the form of report annually. The statistics about no. of scheduled castes, backward classes, ex-servicemen, wards of freedom fighter and handicapped employees is also given.

Since March, 1993 the information regarding semi- Govt. employees working in Boards, Corporation, Municipalities, Municipal Corporations, Market Committees, Improvement Trusts has been incorporated in this publication.

2. Municipal Statistics of Punjab:

In this report important data of all the Municipal Councils and Municipal Corporations of the State about important census, Vital Health, Education, Water-supply, Entertainment facilities, Hotels, Veterinary Hospitals, Banks, Roads, Sports facilities, Diesel, Petrol & Gas facilities etc. is published. The report is published annually.

3. Building Material Prices and Wages of Labourer:

- a) Data regarding building material prices and wages of different types of labourers is collected quarterly from all the districts and after compilation it is sent to National Building organisation, Govt. of India, New Delhi.
- b) Index number of building construction cost for 17 districts is prepared annually & sent to NBO, Govt. of India, New Delhi.

4. Private Building Construction and Public Sector Activities:

The information about private building construction from all group I & II and 10% Groups B&C Municipal Councils/corporations in the state is collected and organized and sent to NBO, Govt. of India New Delhi.

5. Population Statistics

- a) Statistics of Population are being prepared as per the requirements of the other departments of the State.
- b) Whenever new districts and tehsils are created, the area and population are compiled according to the new boundaries of the districts.
- c) Some tables are prepared to include in Statistical Abstract of Punjab every year & other publications every year.

During the year 2006-2007 following work was done:-

1. Census of Punjab Govt. & Semi-Govt. Employees

- a) Report as on 31.3.2005 was prepared. After the approval of Economic Adviser to Govt. Punjab got computerized and placed on website .
- b) Information regarding Census of Punjab Govt. & Semi- Govt. Employees as on 31.3.2006 was collected from the offices situated at Chandigarh through personal visits and also got collected it from all the 17 districts Data was scrutinised.

2. Municipal Year Book

- a) Report of Municipal Year Book for the year 2003-04 was prepared and after its approval from Economic Adviser got it computerized.
- b) Report of Municipal year Book for the year 2004-05 was prepared and submitted for approval of higher officers.
- c) Information regarding Municipal Year Book for the year 2005-06 from 17 districts of the State was received. The information of 5 districts was scrutinized.

3. Prices of Building Material & Wages of the Labourers.

- a) Information regarding prices of Building Material and Wages of Labour for the quarter ending 31.3.2006,30.6.2006,30.9.2006 and 31.12.2006 was prepared and sent to N.B.O. Govt. of India, New Delhi.
- b) Building Construction Cost Index for the year 2006 has been prepared for 17 districts and sent to N.B.O. Govt. of India, New Delhi.

4. Area & Population Statistics

On the basis of Census 2001 Table No. 3.1 and 3.8 relating to the Statistics of area & Population were prepared according to the new districts i.e. Tarn Taran, S.A.S.Nagar and Barnala and sent for printing in the Statistical Abstract of Punjab.

5. Best Practices and Data with regard to Policy for Muslim Empowerment

Information regarding Muslim Employees in the State was collected from the 140 offices/Boards/ Corporations situated at Chandigarh through personal visits and also collected/received information from 19 districts . Information of 3 districts got computerized.

XI. IRRIGATION & POWER

Main Function of Irrigation Section is to prepare below given two reports:

1. Energy Statistics of Punjab'

In this report district wise and statewise information pertaining to various aspects of energy is disseminated. It contains comprehensive information about consumption, transmission and distribution of electricity, number of transformers, towns and villages electrified, number of gas connections, no of Gobar Gas plants, consumption of petrol, high speed diesel & kerosene oil etc. Comparative figures for other states on different aspect are also given where ever possible

2. 'Irrigation, Floods and Water logging Statistics of Punjab'

This report contains mainly tehsilwise data relating to number of tubewells/pumping sets, net area irrigated, cropwise gross irrigated area and area under different water management schemes. This data is collected from all District Statistical Offices, Director Land Records, Jalandhar and other concerned offices located at Chandigarh.

During the year 2006-2007 following work was done:-

1. One copy of the approved report Energy Statistics of Punjab for the year 2003-04 zeroxed (photo copy)
2. 15 Tables of the report Energy Statistics of Punjab were prepared for the year 2005-06.

MISC.

- A. 15 Tables relating to Energy Chapter of the State Abstract 2006 were prepared.
- B. 9 Tables relating to Energy Chapter for Economic Survey 2006-07 were prepared along with chapter write –up in English and Punjabi.
- C. Critical Economic Indicators for the year 2004-05 were prepared and sent to Head Office.
- D. Information was collected from 15 offices relating to employees for the year 2005, information was collected from 20 offices relating to Best Practices and Data regarding policies for Muslims and State Employees for the year 2006.

XII. FARM ACCOUNTS

Farm Accounts Section prepares following two reports annually .

- i) Farm Accounts Of Selected Cultivators.
- ii) Family Budget of Selected Cultivators.

The main objective of these reports is to assess the yearly income & expenditure of selected cultivators from farming and from other sources. Theses reports depict comparative economic position of the selected mechanized, semi-mechanized and non-mechanized holdings. For this purpose one mechanized and one Semi-mechanized holding is selected by District Statistical Office from each tehsil of the District in Punjab. During the year 2006-07, 72 mechanized holdings, 72semi-mechanized holdings and 4 non-mechanized holdings (Bullock Operated) were selected. All these selected cultivators record their day to day data relating to family income and expenditure pertaining to the agricultural year (From July to Next June) in the prescribed proformae. Annual report from the selected cultivators is collected in the month of July every year by the field staff and is supplied to Head Office for compilation and preparation of report. As an incentive of sum of Rs.500/- per annum honorarium is given to the selected

cultivators to maintain the accurate data. This publication is of great use to Planners, Scholars, Universities & Legislatures.

During the year 2006-2007 following work was done:-

1. The Report 'Family Budget of Selected Cultivators' 2004-05 prepared and sent to press after the approval of E.A. Report for the year 2002-03 received from press after printing.
2. Report 'Farm Accounts in Punjab' 2005-06 was prepared and put for approval. Reports for the year 2003-04 and 2004-05 received from press after printing and placed on website [www.pbplanning .gov.in](http://www.pbplanning.gov.in)
3. The case of honorarium to selected Cultivators for the year 2005-06 and 2006-07 sent for approval of Govt.
4. Accounts being maintained by the cultivators were checked by the field staff posted at District/Block level.

XIII. NATIONAL SAMPLE SURVEY

The National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) was started by Govt. of India in 1950, to collect comprehensive socio-economic data relating to different sectors on National Basis required by Central and State Govts., Planning commission and other interested organisations. The National Sample Survey (NSS) is a large scale survey conducted at National level by Govt. of India in the form of successive rounds, each round covering topics of current interest. The Punjab State joined this scheme on equal matching basis during 14th round in the year 1958-59. The objective of collection of data through NSS scheme is first to obtain exclusive sample results for the State of Punjab for its onward transmission to NSSO (Govt. of India) for pooling of Central and State sample results and secondly to provide statistical information to various Government departments as and when required by them.

During the year 2006-2007 following work was done:-

During this period field work regarding 4th sub/round of 62nd Round of NSS was started from April, 2006 to June, 2007. Total 88 samples (R-34, U-54) were surveyed and approximately 2112 schedules were filled in and 30 samples were scrutinized. A Training Conference for the 63rd round of NSS was attended by the Dy.E.S.A, R.O. and A.R.O. and Investigators at Regional Office of NSSO (G.O.I.) at Ludhiana discussion was held regarding the data to be collected on different aspects like employment-unemployment, manufacturing enterprises and Household Consumer Expenditure.

On the basis of instructions/guidelines issued in Training Workshop at Ludhiana. A training workshop was organized for the different 8 circles of the State Head Office, Chandigarh in the month of July, 2006.

Field survey work of 63rd round of NSS was started. A number of 196 urban and 81 rural samples were completed on 31st March, 2007. Approximately 5147 schedules were filled and apart from it 80 samples were scrutinized.

Field survey work was also checked by the officers/supervisors from Head Office in the field from time to time and needful guidance was given to the field staff about survey work as and when required by them.

XIV. TABULATION

Tabulation section tabulates the data of National Sample Survey (State Sample) collected from the field under various rounds. Processing and tabulation of data is done in accordance with the procedure and tabulation plan supplied by the National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) Govt. of India, New Delhi.

During the year 2006-2007 following work was done:-

The processing and tabulation of state sample data on socio-economic surveys is lagging behind as there is no hardware /software facilities in this office . It is further clarified that all out efforts are being made for the provision of hardware/software facilities for this purpose from the State Govt.

XV. TRAINING

The Training Cell was set up in Economic and Statistical Organisation, Punjab in 1980 on the recommendations of third Conference of Central and State Statistical Organisation held in 2/1977 .The main objective of the training cell is to make the statistical personnel conversant with the concepts, definitions and terminology of the subjects like elementary Statistics, Economics and Mathematics used in the field of statistics.

During this period 72nd batch of training was conducted especially for the newly recruited Investigators of District level offices from 17.7.2006 to 28.7.2006.Lectures on Economics, Statistics and Mathematics were also prepared for the above said batch. On completion of training, a test was conducted and results was conveyed to the concerned Investigators.

XVI. ART

Main function of the section is to prepare titles, graphical charts/pictogrammes, maps and other visual aids for various publications/reports/folders and brouchers of Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab.

During the year 2006-07, 50 black and white charts for printing in publications, 5 Black and white title designs including their colour schemes for the publications, 3 maps for renovation of office building and 8 multi coloured displaying charts were prepared as per requirement of department.

XVII. HUMAN DEVELOPMENT RESEARCH & CO-ORDINATION.

Work done during the 2006-07

Human Development report of Punjab was released in Nov. 2004. As a follow up of this report many steps are being taken up.

1. Follow up Action : Various Departments were reported to implement actionable points of the report. Most of the departments have taken appropriate action on these points.
2. Strengthening State Plans : A proposal was submitted to Planning Commission and UNDP containing eight studies and assistance in terms of inputs like computers and other requirements. In this regard, MOU has been received from UNDP.
3. Livelihood Study: Livelihood study across sectors in Punjab has been given to WAPCOS Ltd, Gurgaon. Preliminary report for this study have been submitted by the

consultant agency. The final draft report will likely to be submitted in the month of November, 2007 by the consultant agency.

4. Three Thematic Studies: Three studies i.e. (1) Gender Empowerment and declining Sex Ratio (2) Problem of Migrant Labourers in Punjab (3) Drop out Rate of School Children in Punjab. Advertisement in Newspapers was given for the selection of consultant Agency on 08.03.2007 & ten consultant agencies have been applied for these studies.

5. District Human Development Reports: Two districts Hoshiarpur and Sangrur of the state have been selected for preparing the District Human Development Report. In this regard UNDP and Planning Commission have given their consent to give this work to Universities. For District Hoshiarpur, Panjab University, Chandigarh is taking up this task and for District Sangrur, Punjabi University Patiala is taking up this task.

XVIII. ECONOMIC CENSUS

Economic Census Section was created to conduct the 5th Economic Census in the State of Punjab. Economic & Statistical Organization, Punjab, was the nodal department for conduct of Fifth Economic Census in Punjab which was conducted by the Govt. of India through out the country. Field work of Economic census had already been completed. All schedules were scanned and edited at the Data Entry Centre of Govt. of India at Chandigarh All error free files have been transmitted to Govt. of India, New Delhi.

Work done during the 2006-07

1. To make Economic Census data error free, data of six districts (Patiala, Faridkot, Bathinda, Sangrur, Jalandhar and Mansa) was sent to concerned districts for editing.
2. C.D. for the third round of the district Nawanshehar was edited and second round editing was done for the three districts Kapurthala, Mukatsar and Firozpur in May, 2006.
3. In June, 2006 second round information for the districts Gurdaspur, Amritsar and Ludhiana was edited and sent to the districts for further correction.
4. In July, 2006 second round data was received from 14 districts (Gurdaspur, Kapurthala, Jalandhar, Hoshiarpur, Nawanshehar, Ropar, Fatehgarh Sahib, Moga, Mukatsar, Faridkot, Bathinda, Mansa, Sangrur and Patiala) which was placed at the Data Entry Centre Sector-19, Chandigarh.
5. In August, 2006 the information for the third round of the State was edited and second round CDs were received from Ludhiana and Firozpur districts.
6. In September, 2006 data related to 14 districts for the fourth round was made error free at district level and placed at the Data Entry Centre, Chandigarh.
7. In October, 2006 CDs for the third round were received from three districts Amritsar, Firozpur and Ludhiana and made error free at Data Entry Centre, Chandigarh.
8. In November, 2006 the work for the 4th round for editing was completed for the 17 districts and the accurate data was placed at the Data Entry Centre, Chandigarh.
9. In December, 2006 list of enterprises with 500 workers or more for the 14 districts was released by the Data Entry Centre for checking. Workers were again verified by the District Officers.

10. In January, 2007 enterprises in House Lists of enterprise lists were compared with provisional results for the 17 districts. Discrepancies, if any got corrected and verified by the DSOs.
11. In February, 2007 disputed batch report (CD) was received from the Data Entry Centre, Chandigarh. Missing information was completed in the ASCII file at the Data Entry Centre, Chandigarh.
12. In February, 2007 file updation work for the Fifth Economic Census-2005 was completed and error free ASCII file was transmitted to Data Processing Division of the Registrar General India, New Delhi.
13. Quick estimates of Fifth Economic Census-2005 and a comparison of enterprises with 1998 Economic Census were given on website www.pbplanning.gov.in.

XIX. Member of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme

The Prime Minister on 23rd of December, 1993 announced the "Member of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme" (MPLADS) in the Parliament. Pursuant to these guidelines the Department of Statistics and Programme Implementation, Ministry of Planning and Programme Implementation has been looking after the scheme at all India level.

Under this scheme, funds to the tune of Rs. 2.00 crores are allotted to Member of Parliament every year., which are allocated on the basis of recommendation made by the MPs and are spent on development works carried under the supervision of Deputy Commissioner in the respective areas at district level. At the State level, the Department of Planning is Nodal Agency to look after/monitor this scheme. Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab (E.S.O.) is performing the duty as Nodal Department under this scheme and maintaining liaison with the Deputy Commissioners at the District level and Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation Govt. of India.

During 2006-07 following work was done:-

1. CAG Report

Some of the paras relating to CAG report 1996-97 and 1999-2000 have been accepted by the Ministry. Efforts were made to settle the remaining pending paras.

2. Reply Unstarred & Starred Question.

Reply to provisional Starred Question Dy.No. 11624 dated 10.5.2006, Unstarred Question No. 2925 dated 13.12.2006 and Starred Question No. 11897 for 21.3.2007 was prepared and sent to MOSPI, GOI.

3. Working of software

Work of computerisation of MPLADS works, was pursued vigorously with district authorities. As on 31.3.2007, 94% works have been onloaded.

4. Public Accounts Committee

Public Accounts Committee dropped all paras which were pending before it relating to year 1996-97.

5. Unspent Balance.

An unspent balance of Rs. 63.95 lac lying in the accounts of Retired Rajya Sabha members was transferred on Jan. 15.2007 to the account of sitting Rajya Sabha MPs.

6. Meeting of Secretaries of State Government.

Parawise reply to Agenda Notes were prepared for the meeting of Secretaries in charge of Nodal Department for MPLADS of State/U.T. held on 28.7.2006 15.12.2006 at New Delhi. Review meeting of MPLADS was taken by Sh. G.K. Vasan, Hon'ble Minister of State (Independent charge) for Statistics & Programme Implementation with State Govt. Officers on 7.8.2006 at Chandigarh.

7. Meeting.

Scheme was reviewed by Chief Secretary in the Deputy Commissioners conference held on 30.5.2006 and it was reviewed by Secretary Planning with DESAs in the meeting held during the year on 23.6.2006, 21.9.2006 and 16.1.2007.

State Committee on MPLADS was constituted and its first meeting was held on 11.12.2006 at Chandigarh.

DISTRICT STATISTICAL OFFICES

The work of each District Statistical Office is supervised by the Deputy Economic & Statistical Adviser. These offices help in collection and compilation of primary and secondary data and co-ordinate the statistical activities of various departments at the district level. Deputy Economic & Statistical Advisers-cum-Additional Secretaries play an important role and provide secretariat services to Deputy Commissioners-cum-Secretaries of the District Planning & Development Boards and are fully involved in the formulation and monitoring of progress of the district level plan schemes.
